Primary School Sport Funding 2020-21

Furley Park Primary Academy

The Government have provided Primary Schools additional funding for academic years each year since 2013 to improve provision of PE and sport in primary schools. Funding has been allocated to all maintained and state-funded schools with primary phase pupils. Each school is allocated £16,000 and an additional £10 per child between the ages of 5-11.

Furley Park has been given the responsibility to ensure that this funding is spent in line with the conditions of grant published on the DFE website. Our priorities for this year under each of the Key Indicators are as follows:

Key indicator 1: The engagement of <u>all</u> pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officers guidelines recommend that primary school pupils undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school

- All children within Furley Park Primary Academy will take part in two PE lessons each week. Where teacher subject knowledge and confidence is low, one or both of these sessions will be led by the Sports Coach. Through careful observation, team planning and teaching and a review of identified areas by the Sports Coach and teacher we hope to increase staff members' confidence and knowledge of teaching PE.
- Children will be encouraged to walk/cycle/scoot to school and take part in the Walk on Wednesday Incentive.
- Each class will nominate two play leaders, who will be given play leader packs, resources for the playground for each class and support to encourage their classmates to join in with games and activities during their bubble's breaktimes.
- Teachers will be encouraged to engage their class in physical activity throughout the day (Brain breaks, GoNoodle, Yoga, etc)

These actions are reliant on school becoming more flexible in relation to COVID guidelines:

- After school clubs will be reinstated as soon as it is COVID secure. Increasing the sporting opportunities the children have access to within Furley Park.
- Children will regularly take part in Active Maths to encourage them to be active in other areas of the curriculum.

Key indicator 2: The profile of PESSPA being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

- Children will be encouraged to share their sporting achievements from outside school. These will be celebrated both in class and during whole school Gold Star Assembly, which until COVID restrictions are relaxed, are held virtually. Sporting achievements will also be mentioned in the school newsletter.
- Our Sports Coach will run interventions for children who require extra support, for example; Fizzy and Sensory Circuits.
- Our aim is for all PE teaching to be either Good or better through targeted CPD with the Sports Coach.
- PE teaching will encompass the whole person, taking into account thinking, social and personal skills as well as the physical and tactical skills.
- Our sporting House Mascots will be referred to more frequently as excellent role models to engage children and encourage them to strive for their best at all times.

These actions are reliant on school becoming more flexible in relation to COVID guidelines:

• Whole school sports day will take place in the summer term.

Key indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

- Teachers will receive comprehensive CPD, led by the Sports Coach, in areas of weakness which have been identified from staff questionnaires.
- The PE Scheme of Work, including long and medium term planning will be completed and regularly updated in collaboration with our Academy Partner School, Hamstreet Primary Academy. This planning will include progression of skills and will be available to all staff across the two academies.
- All teachers, including the Sports Coach, will receive support in teaching dance, an area of whole school weakness, through an online support programme.
- An effective tool for assessing PE will be developed to support teachers and the Sports Coach in planning for progression.

Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

• We will ensure that a wide range of sports are provided through in school lessons and, once it is safe to do so, after school opportunities.

These actions are reliant on school becoming more flexible in relation to COVID guidelines:

- We will utilise the skills of other staff members to upskill the teachers leading swimming to improve the quality of children's physical education in swimming to ensure all children at the end of KS2 are confident and competent to swim 25m.
- We will offer top up swimming lessons, where possible, for children who missed out due to lockdown.

Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

These actions are reliant on school becoming more flexible in relation to COVID guidelines:

- As a school, we will take part in local competitions and events involving as many different children as
 possible.
- We will offer in house competitive events.
